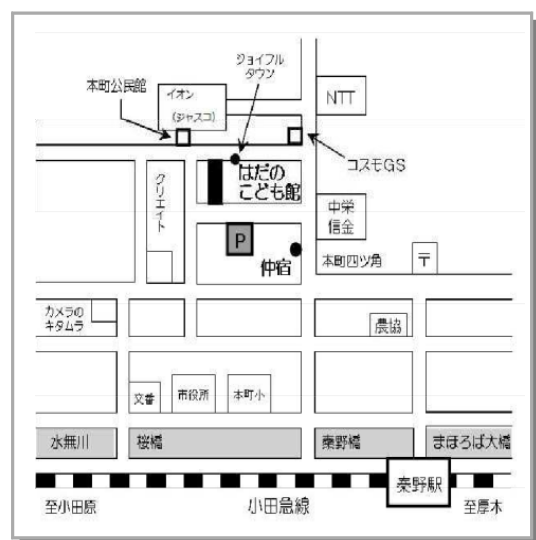

The history of Hadano Japanese Language Class

In 1987 : An incident occurred in Hadano

A Cambodian father who was a refugee from Indochina killed his wife, daughter, and son. because they hadn't been able to adjust to Japanese life. This event set off an inquiry into the problems refugees had while living in Japan. This inquiry was led by two Spanish nuns. It turned out that the major problem was the necessity to learn the Japanese language. Shortly after these results were published the volunteer activity for teaching Japanese to foreign nationals was organized.

In 1987 : The Japanese class started

In 1988 : "Tonan Ajia no Hitobito to Tomo ni Ayumu Kai " was founded

Led by the Spanish nun, Hadano citizens began giving Japanese lessons to foreign nationals. This volunteer activity was also started by students at Sophia Junior College.

In 1990 : "Chunanbei no Hitobito wo Kangaeru Kai" was founded

Japanese lessons were started for people of Japanese descent. who had been born and raised in other countries, primarily South and Middle American.

In 2005 : The above two associations were the precursors to the Hadano Japanese Language Class

Hadano Japanese Language Class was founded as an offshoot of the two associations.
